Dear Chairman Hoeven, Ranking Member Shaheen, Chairman Harris, Ranking Member Bishop, Chairwoman Collins, Ranking Member Murray, Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro:

We the undersigned national and state public health, medical, law enforcement, and consumer protection organizations – as well as families harmed by these products – urge you to include language in the final FY 2026 Agriculture Appropriations bill that closes the loopholes in the 2018 Farm Bill by redefining hemp to specifically exclude hemp-derived THC and all other psychoactive substances derived from hemp that have similar effects to delta-9 THC – the main intoxicating chemical in marijuana. These loopholes have resulted in the nationwide availability of highly intoxicating hemp-derived THC products.

The 2018 Farm Bill's definition of hemp has been interpreted by the hemp industry as "legalizing" hemp-derived THC and all other psychoactive substances derived from hemp (e.g., delta-8 THC, delta-10 THC, HHC, THC-O, etc.) that have similar effects as delta-9 THC. ¹⁻² The

current definition of hemp has created serious challenges for regulators and public-health officials, while fueling widespread, largely unmonitored sales of highly intoxicating products. These substances are now sold nationwide – in gas stations, convenience stores, head shops and online – in ways that are purposely made both accessible and attractive to youth. 3-7 These substances are often sold in the form of gummies, chocolates, chips, candies, and cookies. 1-4 Many of these products display brightly colored cartoon characters and names which are specifically designed to appeal to children such as "Grape Ape", "Girl Scout Cookie", "Pineapple Express", "S'mores Chocolate", "Space Gods" and "Rainbow Sourbelts". 8 Consistent with concerns regarding youth access and appeal, national data from 2024 shows that one-ineight 12th graders (12.3%) reported using delta-8 THC in the past year. 9 This is likely an underestimation of their use, considering the dozens of other hemp-derived THC and other psychoactive products derived from hemp in addition to delta-8 THC being sold across the United States. 2-4,7

Hemp-derived THC products and other psychoactive products derived from hemp are chemically synthesized or converted from the CBD in hemp through processes which result in impurities and dangerous chemicals such as strong acids and heavy metals being left behind in the final product. There have been thousands of calls to U.S. poison control centers from use of these products, more than 30% for children 5 years and younger. Research suggests that use of hemp-derived THC products and other psychoactive products derived from hemp is associated with acute psychiatric disorders including severe psychosis, and lung, chest, and heart disorders, as well as injuries and poisonings. However, we will not know the full extent of their harms for many years.

Trying to regulate hemp-derived THC products and other psychoactive products derived from hemp will not work.¹⁻³ These products remain widely available in many states that have tried to ban them.^{3,7} To protect the health and safety of our communities, we need to completely close the federal loophole by explicitly excluding these products from the definition of hemp. These products are continually innovated to circumvent existing regulations, underscoring the urgent need for a comprehensive ban to effectively curtail their availability.¹⁻³
